

Greetings to God's Beloved,

"I've had an Epiphany!" I wonder with amusement if the origin of today's celebration of the Epiphany was due to one of the Magi saying this very thing. Probably not...

But we do have epiphanies, don't we? Suddenly we understand what we did not previously understand. It is then that we can never see ourselves or the world around us the same way again. Personally, I pray that this phenomenon and process will continue for the rest of my days. I learn so much. God and the Holy Spirit shape and reshape my heart and mind every time. It is always for the better.

Perhaps the greatest Epiphany (and the reason we designate this day as such) came to the Wise Men. They were Three Kings of different countries, beliefs, ways of seeing their world around them. Yet, within each, came the desire to follow a star – to find the Messiah. And in their seeking, they found him. In their discovery came the greatest of all epiphanies – this child, the Son of God, was not born in promise to a single nation. Instead, God's Messiah was born in promise to all nations – to every single person with no exception. That promise? That we would never be separated from the Love of God in Christ Jesus.

This promise holds true today. The Love of God and the Salvation offered through Jesus has no boundaries, no limits.

Star Words

The season after Christmas and before Lent can often seem like a "down" time in the church year—as if we're simply marking time while waiting for another grand celebration. Whether it is because people are suffering from holiday fatigue or influenced by gloomy winter weather, the season of Epiphany can go by unnoticed and unheralded.

Since we cannot do our St. Matthias tradition of serving *galettes des rois* (King Cake) we are offering another way to offer a spiritual practice called Star Words. A star word is simply a star-shaped piece of paper with a word printed on it. People attending services this Sunday (1/10) will be invited to choose a star after our worship and are asked to reflect on that word for the coming year. The people are invited to ponder what significance this word might have in their lives, and how God might be speaking to them through that simple message.

The premise is this: the Magi followed the star to find baby Jesus, bringing their gifts. We are also seeking Jesus, trusting God can/does use many signs (or stars) to guide us closer to the Divine presence.

We will be mailing your star word to you the following week. Everyone who receives a star word is encouraged to hang it up where they are sure to see it every day. It may be on their bathroom mirror, or next to their computer screen. Many people keep their star words from year to year; gradually accumulating a virtual constellation of wise words and encouragement displayed as a reminder of God's presence in our lives.
